CALL THE POLICE!

The reshuffle that is in progress in connection with Pirie's
police force has become so sweeping that citizens, who
accept the service as a matter of course, are taking notice.
Important changes have taken or are taking place, including
transfer of Inspector of the Northern Division, sergeant-in-
charge, and leading plainclothes man, closure of Pirie West Police
Station as such, and transfer of several constables.

When the average citizen sets aside the inspector, whose duty
it is to cover the whole division, at first glance he has a feeling of
surprise on noting that there are 19 officers, including a woman,
to watch over law and order in this town of 12,500 souls. More
so does that thought arise when, in case of emergency, he calls
for a policeman and cannot secure one "on the dot."

BUT the police force, like every other union organisation, works
to a system of hours, and while the men do not enjoy the
40-hour week or the lead price bonus, they have their eight hours
a day to put in. For analysis purposes we may eliminate the
sergeant-in-charge, who is an administrator (though Pirie's Sgt.
Merrett works the hours of three men), the plainclothes men who
have their enquiry duties, as has also the woman officer, two of
the rank and file who do clerical work, and two men who are in
charge of suburban stations (or have been), with their many
public calls, day and night. Add to those facts the absence on
leave almost continuously of two men, a little sick leave here
and there, and few are left to maintain patrol of the town over
three shifts in the 24 hours.

Escort silver and gold to train or plane, being on hand
when big boys are being handled, and periodic trips to the city
with prisoners all cut into the strength of the local force. Final
summing-up is that it is under-manned.

MAAYBE that is why the commissioner has ordered the closure
of Pirie West Station, which has done duty with a growing
population for about 30 years. Whether that was wise or not
only time will tell.

A new inspector has taken over the task of Insp. Boythorn.
He has come with the knowledge that this town is as efficiently
policed as any in Australia—proved not only by comparative
absence of serious crime (singular in a seaport with world
entrances), but by the few cases which remain unsolved and the
swiftness with which the majority are cleaned up. And certainly
we are not over-staffed.

ONLY ONE MUNICIPAL CONTEST IN PIRIE TOMORROW

Cr. O'Brien Opposed By Mr. J. O. Geddes In Solomontown Ward

Only contest for a seat in Pirie Town Council tomorrow, when municipal and district council elections will be held throughout the State, will be in Solomontown Ward, where Cr. G. L. O'Brien (sitting A.L.P. member) will be opposed by Mr. J. O. Geddes (L.C.L.).

Polling booths will be at the town hall, Solomontown Church Circle, and Pirie South Baptist Hall. Voters will be required to indicate the candidate of their choice by placing a cross only in the square opposite his name.

Votes may be recorded between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., and the poll will be declared by Mr. J. H. S. Leakey (returning officer) in the meeting room at the town hall at 6.30 p.m.

In 1949, when there were polls in three wards, Cr. O'Brien, who was opposed by Messrs. D. B. Middleton, won the seat by four votes, figures being 185 to 181. A total of 377 votes (including 11 informal) were cast.

Candidates' Views

Cr. O'Brien Says:

Most ratepayers realise that the council doing the best possible in difficult circumstances. In Solomontown Ward alone there is sufficient work for the present road gang for two or three years. Of £2,100 spent in the ward during the past 12 months £850 was put into new roads. Work on Main road has been held up pending laying of new water mains.

Following my efforts attention is to be given to Three Chain road with the aid of a Highways and Local Government Department grant, which became available on July 1.

Realising the effect of the manpower shortage, I have adopted mechanism of plant including purchase of a front-end loader with grader blade, a patent refuse collection vehicle, and a spray pump for weed destruction.

The council is preparing a scheme of reconstruction within the limit of its borrowing powers for submission to ratepayers, seeking their approval. If the matter comes to fruition I shall press for engagement of more men or contractors to go ahead with the work, particularly urgent jobs.

Most Governments, Federal and State, seem to have the idea of discarding councils for spending much money and supporting only very necessary work, while private enterprise is competing for men and material. It appears to be most difficult for local governing bodies to obtain sufficient financial assistance in the circumstances.

While in the present financial position of the council it is impossible to build bitumen roads and concrete footpaths, it is possible to assist in building good citizens by encouraging good citizens by encouraging facilities. In that regard I have done my best for all branches.

Two years ago, I advocated seeking a resident doctor for Solomontown. As a result of my activities consulting rooms were made available, but a doctor was unavailable owing to pressure of duties in the main Pirie area.

Mr. Geddes Says:

With rising cost of labour, materials, and services it seems

obvious that our council cannot function on the existing system of rating, and I would urge a thorough investigation on the question of improvement of the corporation's finances through rating.

Roadwork is a constant problem to successive councils in Pirie. I believe that the solution may lie in having the work done by contract labor.

Another factor which would receive my consideration if elected would be the lackling of storm water drainage, which also has been a worrying subject.

While there are appreciable difficulties in the way of a loan for road and footpath work, I think that avenue should be pursued to the fullest extent to ascertain if a satisfactory loan could be raised at a low rate of interest.

This is my first attempt at civic honors. I was born in the town and, except for a few years in Adelaide during my education and six years with the armed forces during World War II, have been a resident here since.

My grandfather, the late Mr. Charles Geddes, came to Pirie in the 1870s and played his part in the life of Pirie, rising to the mayoralty. In his turn my father also occupied the mayoral chair.

While my candidature is sponsored by Liberal and Country League, we do not hold that party politics should become part of our civic governing body.

I can assure the ratepayers that if elected, I shall be a strong advocate of a progressive policy in council affairs.

Record Entries; Start Tonight

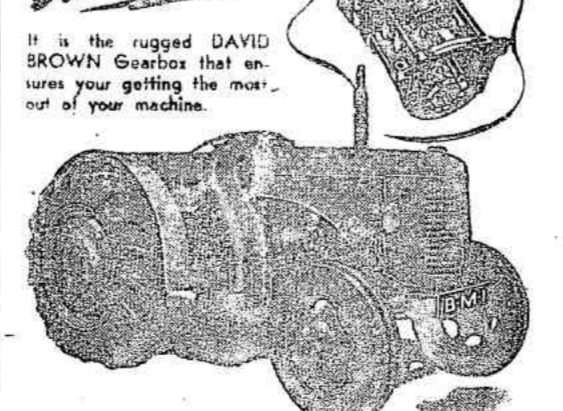

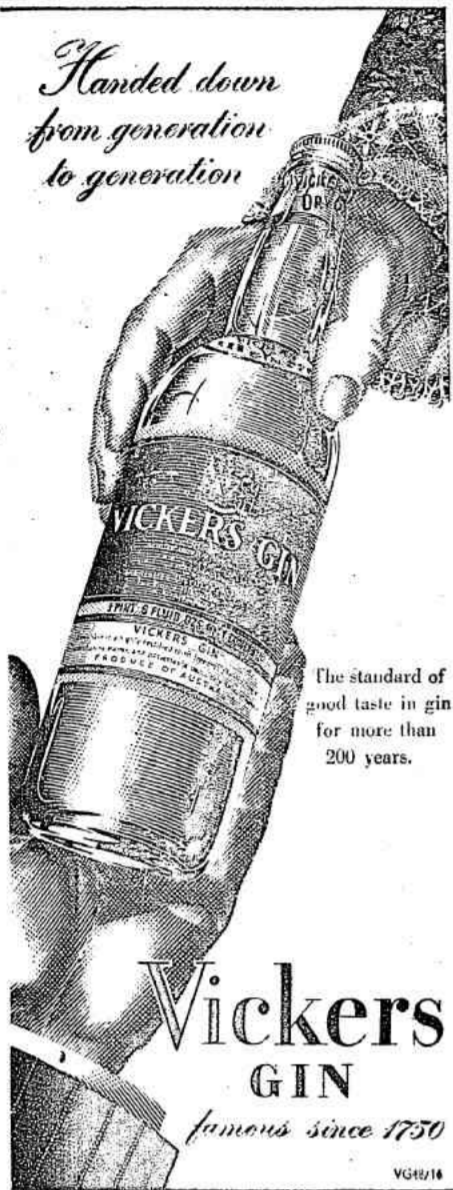

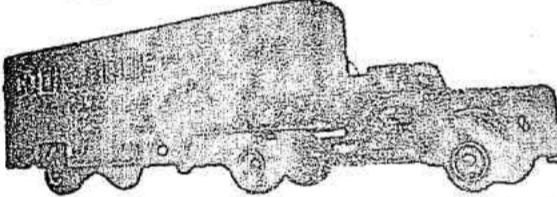
